from ALAN on NC's transportation waivers were provided to NC Counts Coalition to help them move relief supplies to affected areas safely.

2 TRUCKLOADS



of water and MREs were transported from Florida City, FL, to West Palm Beach, FL, to help the Eagles Wings Foundation. Transportation was donated by Cowan Systems.

8 PALLET JACKS



from NOBLELIFT were donated to Distribute Aid to support grassroots response organizations to help organize and distribute aid to other community partners.



120 PALLETS



of plywood were transported by C.H. Robinson to Ocala, FL, so Compassionate Alliance can begin rebuilding homes destroyed by Helene.

of food storage containers were transported by GLT from Mechanicsburg, PA, to Raleigh, NC, as a donation for Distribute Aid and ALAN's Gulf Coast Prepositioning Project.

of hydrating energy drinks were transported by Saddle Creek Logistics from Jay, ME, to Asheville, NC, as a donation to the Asheville Fire Department.

Stories From The Field



Katherine, ALAN Volunteer

In early October, Katherine, a logistics professional and ALAN volunteer, traveled to Western North Carolina to provide much-needed hands-on support.



One of the most significant challenges Katherine observed was the lack of organization and understanding around high-mover supplies, or items that are in constant demand. Critical products like diapers, formula, and medical goods were being requested by almost every survivor in need and lack of a systemized process slowed down fulfillment. Volunteers, although eager to help, were often picking up where others left off, resulting in a disorganized flow of resources and a longer ramp-up to understand the setup.

To address this, Katherine emphasized the importance of labeling and organizing donation areas. "If areas were clearly marked by type of supplies, it would allow volunteers to easily find what was needed and provide continuity," she explained.

One day, while sorting through diapers and baby formula, a man entered the depot, desperate for non-dairy formula for a baby. Because Katherine had categorized the formula by type, she was able to immediately retrieve the exact item he needed and send him back with the necessary supplies. This quick action made a significant difference in that family's ability to care for their child, highlighting the vital role that organization and logistics play in relief efforts.

When Hurricane Helene devastated parts of North Carolina, many lost not only their homes but also essential medical equipment that maintained their quality of life. For those who rely on canes, wheelchairs, oxygen supplies, or specialized beds, losing access to this equipment can be life-threatening. Understanding this, FODAC immediately began assessing the needs of these communities, working closely with their local partners like Centers for Independent Living (CILs) and Area Agencies on Aging. The challenge, however, was finding adequate and immediate transportation to ensure critically needed supplies arrived as the needs were identified. That's where ALAN came in.

ALAN provided critical logistics and transportation support that enabled FODAC to respond swiftly. With ALAN's network of partners, they facilitated the shipment of 40 pallets of medical supplies—everything from wheelchairs to bariatric hospital beds—into disaster–stricken areas across Western North Carolina. Their transportation services allowed FODAC to focus on coordinating with local partners and meeting the needs of the disabled and elderly without the burden of arranging complex logistics.
